On Popularity of National Museums

Although many museums and galleries are funded by the government, the question of increasing the annual attendance is still a relevant one. With use of the data collected through social statistics we may be able to analyze the situation in this field.

All the information that has been registered over three separate years was asserted and put into a chart. You can see that statistics for the years 2013, 2015 and 2014 are given in the second, third and fourth columns respectively. We are going to draw on the numbers provided by five different institutions, two of which have introduced admission fees in 2014.

It can be noted that for the British Museum as well as the National and the Tate galleries there has been a substantial increase in overall attendance between 2013 and 2017. However, the same is not true for the Natural History Museum and the Science Museum as they were losing visitors at a rapid rate over the same period.
