Computer Based Games for English Learners by ABC company  
The results of a free trial, October 2014

During a free trial that was organised at our school by ABC company students were offered to try some games that would help them to study English. There were 70 participants in the experiment

Form 10: 40 students were divided into 4 groups. Each group was playing games in class during the lessons. The exercises were introducing new grammar material. Students had to fill in the gaps in sentences using the right tense, modal verb or the article. The tests have been done quite successfully - only fewer mistakes were made. The participants qualified this experience as exciting and very useful.

Form 11: The situation is different with Form 11 students. There were 30 students divided into 3 groups who were playing games at home without teachers control. The most attention was stressed on the vocabulary studying based on the learned material. Students had to choose the correct answer from the given variants. For example, they had to choose the antonymous word for the given one. These students also did the tests very well, but surprisingly, their feelings about it weren't very nice. The Form 11 participants qualified this experience as boring and uninteresting.

In my opinion, the difference of judgements is linked with the conditions of working. The Form 10 groups decided it was a pleasure to play some games because it has made the everyday studying process more interesting. But the Form 11 students had to do exercises at home spending their free time on homework. Moreover, the Form 10 students were studying new material while Form 11 were studying the learned constructions which hasn't left them any opportunity to feel themselves explorers.

In conclusion, I'd like to recommend ABC company to improve the programme and make it possible for teachers to look through

the students' works. It would help to spot out the problems.
